

# Nest Building phase



The nest of the Black-throated Blue Warbler is built by the female. She constructs it in shrubs or small trees fairly close to the ground, out of yellow and white birch bark strips that are glued to together with cobwebs and saliva.

# Incubation phase



Nest with clutch of Black-throated Blue Warbler eggs.  
Usually one egg is laid per day.

# Incubation phase



A female Black-throated Blue Warbler must incubate her eggs for about 13 days after the last egg is laid before eggs hatch.

# Nestling phase



Black-throated Blue Warbler nestlings are almost naked when they hatch. Their eyes open at 4 days old, and they are usually ready to leave the nest between 8–9 days old.

# Fledgling phase



A Black-throated Blue Warbler fledgling flies weakly at first, and both parents continue to protect and feed it for 2–3 weeks.
